### What will I be studying?

#### Citizenship

Students will investigate citizenship issues, develop critical awareness and explore some of the different points of view that exist in a democratic society.

#### Shine

Students will learn about

- 1. Relationships and Sex Education (RSE)
- 2. Mental health and wellbeing
- 3. Careers and employability education

## What skills will I develop?

- Recall, selection and communication of knowledge and understanding of citizenship concepts, issues and terminology
- Application of skills, knowledge and understanding when planning, taking part in, and evaluating citizenship actions in a variety of contexts
- Analysis and evaluation of issues and evidence, including different points of view, to enable the construction of reasoned arguments and reach conclusions

### How will the course be structured?

#### Year 10

- Citizenship Our legal and human rights and responsibilities with a focus on equality
- PSHE Education RSE, mental health and wellbeing, careers and employment

#### Year 11

- Citizenship Democracy, Power and Politics with a focus on national government and the role of citizens
- PSHE Education RSE, mental health and emotional resilience, careers and planning for the future

The course will be assessed internally, using existing Key Stage 4 criteria
